The MLT is expected to operate and maintain laboratory equipment, perform quality control and assurance procedures, participate in the implementation of new methodology and evaluations and demonstrate a commitment to continuing education. In addition, the MLT will display courtesy and tact with peers, patients, the public and other hospital staff. Must be prepared to contribute when required with additional tasks such as teaching, method evaluation, technical writing, quality assurance projects, safety etc.
