## 2014 OSMT Annual Report

he Board of Directors of the OSMT is pleased to present this 2014 Annual Report to provide our members with a snapshot of the highlights of the previous year's activities and programs.

## Membership

The OSMT's number one priority is, and will always be, to serve our members. We do so in many ways with benefits, services, programs, and with professional representation. One of the Board's current priorities is to strengthen the OSMT through the provision of valueadded and innovative services. Because of the OSMT's evolving membership composition, we also want to explore our Board structure to ensure there is equitable representation of the Society's membership. The Board recognizes that member input will be critical to these decisions so a pilot discussion session was held during the 2014 OSMT Conference to see how we can engage our members in bringing about some desirable additions and changes. The plan is to have our District Directors roll out these discussion group sessions across Ontario for feedback from our members.

The OSMT's 2014 membership totalled 2,399, with a composition of 41% MLTs, 54% MLA/Ts, and 5% Students and other categories. This was the third consecutive year in the history of the OSMT that the number of MLA/T members surpassed MLT members. Overall, there was a 2% increase in memberships since 2013 and, while this increase was marginal, it is encouraging to see that the downward trend experienced in the last

few years has stabilized.

The OSMT continues to offer a wide variety of programs, services, and benefits, including a superior Personal Professional Liability insurance policy for all our members. The OSMT's quarterly *Advocate* publication runs feature articles, case studies, educational reports, and provides information about issues of interest to the laboratory profession. The Editorial Committee often receives positive comments on the quality of our magazine.

In April 2014, the OSMT purchased a MediaLab subscription so that our members can have free access to over 70 on-line courses that were developed especially for laboratory technologists and technicians. Participants are provided with personalized certificates and training records and many find it an effective way to complete their QA hours. This new addition has proven to be a very popular value added benefit.

## **Conference and Trade Show**

The OSMT 2014 *Outside-the-Lines* Conference and Trade Show was held September 19<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> in the picturesque and historic city of Kingston where delegates enjoyed a weekend of 'learn and play'.

A great weekend began with live music and wine tastings at the President's Reception. Kingston's very own world champion town crier, Chris Whyman, led guests into the conference on Saturday morning, proclaiming our gathering well and truly begun. ## **MLA/T Certification Program**

Talk about branding! Today, people refer to the OSMT Medical Laboratory Assistant/Technician certificate simply as the "OSMT". Established in 1988, the MLA/T certification program has become one of the mainstays of our Society bringing with it new members who now

comprise over half the membership. The MLA/T Competency Guidelines were built on the practices and needs of Ontario laboratories and employers rely on the OSMT to set entry level standards and credentialing for their new employees. Training programs are designed around these competencies. The OSMT also serves as the third party assessor for applications to the Ministry of Training Colleges and Universities Private Institutions Branch. The OSMT has a deep commitment to ensuring that MLA/T Certification stays strong and vital. A continuous validation process is used to ensure that the MLA/T exam is up-to-date and consistent with Ontario legislation and current workplace practices.

## **Advocacy and Communications**

Aside from a wide array of benefits and services, some of the OSMT's most valued work centers on the professional issues that impact the MLTs and MLA/Ts of Ontario. ## **Regulation of Medical Laboratory Assistants/Technicians**

In late 2014, the OSMT participated in a stakeholder consultation meeting with the CMLTO relative to the

College's initiatives to establish a voluntary roster and ultimately to regulate medical laboratory assistants/technicians. In keeping with the OSMT's mandate to serve the interests of our members, the OSMT stated that the Society has numerous reservations about moving forward with these initiatives. The OSMT believes that the impacts, responsibilities, and costs have not been clarified and that there needs to be more education about the regulation for this healthcare provider group. The OSMT Board plans to poll our members, and to have conversations, about regulation in the coming year.

## **Financial Statements**

With fiduciary diligence and responsibility, the OSMT remains in a very solid financial condition. The year 2014 closed with a \$1,823,042 in net assets, \$700,000 of which has been earmarked in a Program Development Fund. The 2014 Financial Statements show total revenues of \$612,540 and expenses of \$552,292 with \$60,248 remaining in net income.

The new Canadian Audit Standards requirements demand a more vigorous audit of certain areas of operations and reporting structures have been modified to comply with current best practices in recognizing assets and liabilities.

The OSMT purchased a new computer system for the office and moved to cloud technology to store our databases and to facilitate conference registrations.

No extraordinary commitments or contracts were outstanding at the end of the year. The Society maintains a \$250,000 internally-restricted reserve as protection against operating costs.
